



3. Notice of motion.
4. Mr. Rajinder Kumar Banku, Deputy Advocate General, Haryana appears and accepts on behalf of the respondent-State.
5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.
6. Apparently, there was no justification for non-appearance of the petitioner before the trial Court. However, since the matter is amicably resolved between the parties and the parties have already filed a petition for quashing of the FIR on the basis of the compromise, this Court is inclined to take a lenient view in the matter and the petitioner is directed to surrender before the trial Court within a period of one week from today and on his appearance, he shall be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate, concerned. The petitioner shall also be liable to pay a costs of Rs.25,000/-, which shall be deposited with the Punjab and Haryana High Court Bar Clerks' Association, within one week.
7. The petition stands disposed off.
