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1. By way of this petition under Section 29A of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 [“the Act”], the petitioner seeks an extension of the mandate of the learned Arbitral Tribunal which is in *seisin* of disputes between the parties, arising out of a work order dated 18.08.2018, pursuant to a judgement dated 29.07.2021 in ARB.P. 632/2021.
