1. Allowed, subject to all just exceptions.

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2. This petition has been filed by the petitioner under Article 226 of the Constitution of India and Section 482 of the Criminal Procedure Code (in short 'Cr.P.C') praying for grant of Parole for a period of 60 days in FIR No.183/2009 registered at Police Station: Tilak Marg, New Delhi under Sections 364A/365/394 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

3. As per the petition, the petitioner applied for parole through email to the concerned authorities on 20.2.2024, that is, on the date when the present petition is drafted. The petition was filed on 22.02.2024 itself.



4. Issue notice.
