“In view of the above mentioned submissions, circumstances and facts, it is, therefore, respectfully prayed that this Hon’ble Court may kindly be pleased to pass an order to quash the case FIR No. FIR No. 804/2014, U/S-380/34 IPC, P.S. Sultanpuri, Delhi, and the same is pending trial before the Hon'ble Court of MS. Sanya Dalal, Ld. MM, Rohini Courts, Delhi for further proceedings, in the interest of justice and for the sake of brevity.
