Pass such order/orders as this Hon'ble court may deem fit and proper under the facts and circumstances of the case, in the interest of justice.”

4. Learned Additional Standing Counsel for the State, on advance notice, submits that the representation, dated 21.03.2024, made by the petitioner to the DCP shall be examined and decided within a period of 15



days, in accordance with law, with due intimation to the petitioner.

5. In view of the above statement, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner seeks leave to withdraw the present petition with liberty to initiate appropriate proceedings in accordance with law, if so advised.

6. Leave and liberty granted.

7. The present petition is dismissed as withdrawn and disposed of accordingly.

8. Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
