ORDER

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1. This petition has been filed seeking directions to the Trial Court to conclude the trial in Case No.359/2018 arising out of an FIR No.165/2017 PS Hazrat Nizamuddin. Status report has been filed. Charge-sheet has been filed on 16th January, 2018 against 6 accused. The case is at the stage of arguments on charge.
2. Besides the status report also states that there are 7 FIRs registered against the husband of the petitioner, out of which 5 FIRs are registered in Delhi and 2 FIRs are registered in Uttar Pradesh. He has been declared a *Bad Character* of PS Hazrat Nizamuddin. The details of the said FIRs registered against the petitioner and their status are as under:
