ORDER

18.07.2024

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1. The petitioner *vide* the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India read with Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeks quashing of FIR No. 0353/2023 registered under Sections 354D/506 IPC at P.S. Bhajan Pura, Delhi and all proceeding emanating therefrom in view of the Settlement arrived at between the parties.

2. Issue notice. Learned ASC accepts notice on behalf of the State.

3. A request for quashing of the FIR has been made on account of the Settlement *inter se* the parties. It is submitted that the FIR was registered due to a mere misunderstanding. It was *inter alia* settled between the parties that petitioner and the settlement is supported with the Affidavits of the petitioner as well as the complainant. The parties are present before this Court in person today, and have been identified by their counsel and Investigating Officer concerned.



4. Today, the complainant who is present in Court states that she has no objection if the FIR is quashed.

5. In view of the above facts that the parties have amicably resolved their differences out of their own free will and without any coercion. Hence, it would be in the interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. Moreover, there is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

6. Accordingly, FIR No. 0353/2023 registered under Sections 354D/506 IPC at P.S. Bhajan Pura, Delhi, and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed, subject to the petitioner and the complainant depositing costs of Rs.10,000/- each with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority.

7. The petition stands disposed of.
