1. The present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C has been filed by the Petitioners for quashing FIR No.680/2022 dated 19.08.2022, registered at Police Station Begum Pur, Delhi for offences punishable under Sections 341/506 IPC. Sections 354/354A/354B/354C/354D/509 IPC were added later after filing of the chargesheet.
2. The Petitioners and the Respondent No.2 herein belong to the same family. Material on record indicates that there are property disputes between the parties. The present FIR has been registered against the Petitioners at the instance of Respondent No.2. Chargesheet has been filed.
3. It is stated that in view of the fact that there are complaints filed by both sides against each other, the parties have decided to buy peace and have amicably settled the disputes. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) dated 08.07.2024 has also been filed with the Petition which reads as under:



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is executed on this 8th day of July, 2024, between:

First Party

Sh. Dharampal Singh, aged about 7, S/o Late Sh. Tarachand, R/o 22/215 New Mandi Baraut, Baghpat, UP 250611 (hereinafter referred to as "Father-in-law").

Second Party

Mrs. Geeta Sharma, aged about 42, W/o Sh. Rahul Chaudhary. R/O H-1007, Pk-7-24, SE-24 (hereinafter referred to as "Daughter-in-law").

WHEREAS, the parties herein, in light of the family matter originating from an ancestral property dispute, have mutually agreed to cease all disputes under the following terms and conditions:

TERMS & CONDITIONS OF THE PRESENT DEED

A. Both parties agree to resolve and withdraw all cases filed in different jurisdictions, including civil and criminal.

B. Any undisclosed cases filed by either party against the other shall be considered settled upon the signing of this MOU.

C. Both parties undertake not to initiate any future cases/complaints/petitions against each other or each other's family members arising from FIR number 680/2022, PS Begumpur. Additionally, the Second Party agrees that the FIR bearing number 793/22 is against unknown individuals and is not being perused against the First Party and his family members.

D. Both parties agree not to interfere in each other's lives or the lives of each other's family members.

E. The parties undertake to withdraw all complaints/cases/litigation of any kind against each other or their family members filed under any provision of law before any court.

F. The parties confirm that the decision to compromise/settle the above matters is voluntary and without any undue influence, coercion, or pressure.

H. The First Party shall file a quashing petition or application of settlement in the pending quashing petition bearing number Crl.M.C. 6165/2022 before the Hon'ble Delhi High Court seeking the quashing of FIR No. 680/2022, PS Begumpur. The Second Party, who is the complainant in the aforementioned FIR, shall cooperate by recording her statement before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi during the quashing proceedings.

4. A perusal of the above MoU shows that the parties have agreed to file



a petition for quashing of the present FIR.

5. Today, the Parties are present in Court. The Petitioners have been identified by their Counsel and the SI Nirmala, D-2856, PS Begampur. The Respondent No.2/complainant has been identified by her Counsel and the Investigating Officer SI Nirmala, D-2856, PS Begampur. The Respondent No.2/complainant states that he has settled all the disputes with the Petitioners out of his own free will, without pressure, coercion or undue influence. It is also stated that in the larger interest of the family she has decided not to pursue the present case any further and requests that the present FIR and the proceedings emanating therefrom may be quashed. The parties undertake that they will remain bound by the MoU dated 08.07.2024 and the proceedings recorded before this Court.

6. The Parties who are present in Court today understand the implications of the present proceedings. In view of the settlement arrived at between the Parties, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose would be served in continuing with the present proceedings. Resultantly, the FIR No.680/2022 dated 19.08.2022, registered at Police Station Begum Pur, Delhi for offences punishable under Sections 341/506/354/354A/354B/354C/354D/509 IPC and the proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby quashed.

7. With the above observations, the petition is disposed of, along with pending application(s), if any.
