3. The application is disposed of.

4. This is a petition filed under Section 29A(4) of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 seeking extension of mandate of the Arbitral Tribunal by a period of 12 months for concluding the arbitral proceedings and passing the final award.



5. Mr Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioner states that because of Insolvency Proceedings against the petitioner, there was some delay in concluding the arbitral proceedings.
6. Issue notice.
7. Mr Singh, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondent and states that he has no objection to the petition being allowed.
8. For the reasons noted above, I am of the view that sufficient cause has been explained for the delay. The petition is allowed and the mandate of the Arbitral Tribunal is extended by a period of 12 months from today.
