CRL.M.A. 2488/2024 (exemption)

1. Allowed, subject to all just exceptions.
2. Application stands disposed of.

W.P.(CRL) 274/2024 & CRL.M.A. 2489/2024 (condonation of delay in filing)

3. This is a petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following reliefs:-

“a. Appropriate writs, order(s) of mandamus or like nature to direct respondent NO.2, to begin with investigation/ register a F.I.R. under appropriate Sections of I.P.C., to collect the evidence, to arrest the accused, to protect the petitioner and his family members.

b. Humbly request before the Hon'ble Court to pass an order to expel respondent no. 3 from the House of Petitioners or pass any assurance or security for the suicide threat given by respondent no. 3.”

4. The dispute essentially, as emerging from the narrative in the writ petition, is between the Petitioners and the daughter-in-law/Respondent No.3. A plain reading of the prayer clause indicates that Petitioners call upon this Court to direct Respondent No.2 to investigate and register an FIR under appropriate Sections of IPC, to collect evidence and arrest the accused as well as grant protection to the Petitioners.

5. Having perused the writ petition and the reliefs sought, the present writ petition is not maintainable in the present forum. Undoubtedly, Petitioners have remedies for each of the reliefs that can be sought before the appropriate Courts.

6. Writ petition along with pending application is dismissed, giving liberty to the Petitioners to take recourse to appropriate remedies before the appropriate forum.
