ORDER

23.09.2024

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1. The present proceedings are instituted on behalf of the petitioners seeking quashing of FIR No. 163/2019 registered under Sections 452/323/341/34 IPC at Police Station Tilak Nagar, Delhi on the ground that the parties have amicably settled their disputes.
2. As per the allegations levelled in the FIR, the petitioners hurled abuses and hit the complainants due to which they suffered some injuries.
3. Mr. Nawal Kishore Jha, learned APP for the State, on instructions, submits that the petitioners are the only accused persons and respondent Nos.2 and 3 are the complainant/victims in the present case. It is further submitted that the charge-sheet has been filed under Sections 323/341/452/34 IPC.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners and respondent nos. 2 and 3 are immediate neighbours and the present FIR was registered due to some misunderstanding and now the parties have amicably settled their disputes before the Mediation Centre, Tis Hazari Courts, Delhi



on 17.07.2023, a copy whereof has been placed on record. In terms of the said settlement, complainant/victims are now left with no claim or grievance against the petitioners. He further states that the petitioners are also the complainant in FIR No.165/2019 registered under Sections 323/341/34 IPC at PS Tilak Nagar, Delhi and the petitioners are taking steps regarding compounding of the same.

5. The petitioners, who are present in Court, have been identified by their counsel as well as the I.O./ SI Pradeep Chauhan PS NFC, New Delhi. Respondent Nos. 2 and 3 are appearing through VC and have been identified by the I.O.

6. The petitioners have shown remorse for their conduct and undertake not to repeat the same in future. Respondent Nos. 2 and 3 also state that they have entered into the aforementioned compromise out of their own free will, volition and without any coercion. They further state that they have no objection if the present FIR and consequent proceedings are quashed.

7. The parties shall remain bound by the statements made in Court today.

8. In view of the above facts and considering that no useful purpose will be served in continuance of the proceedings, it is directed that the aforesaid FIR and the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed.

9. With the above directions, the petition is disposed of alongwith miscellaneous application.
