1. Allowed, subject to all just exceptions.
2. The petitioner shall file legible and clear copies of the exempted documents, compliant with practice rule before the next date.
3. Application stands disposed of.

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4. This is a petition filed under Section 29A(4) of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 seeking extension of the mandate of the Arbitral Tribunal.
5. The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the learned Arbitrator was appointed *vide* order dated 24.11.2021 and her mandate was also extended by this Court *vide* order dated 15.05.2024. He further submits that matter is at the stage of final arguments and which is likely to be concluded soon.
