ORDER

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09.12.2024

1. The present petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners seeking quashing of FIR No. 691/2023 registered under Sections 498-A/406/34 IPC at P.S. Anand Parbat, Delhi on the ground that the parties have amicably settled their disputes.
2. The present FIR is an outcome of a matrimonial dispute between the complainant/respondent No. 2 (wife) and petitioner No. 1 (husband) whereas petitioner Nos. 2 to 4 are the in-laws of the complainant.
3. Mr. Amol Sinha, learned ASC (Crl.) for the State submits that in the present case, the petitioners are the only accused persons and respondent No. 2 is the complainant/victim.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the parties have amicably settled their disputes before the Delhi Mediation Centre, Tis



Hazari Courts on 18.05.2024, a copy of which has been placed on record. In terms of the settlement, the parties have already been granted divorce by mutual consent vide divorce decree dated 24.09.2024 passed by the Family Court, Tis Hazari, Delhi. Further, it was agreed that a sum of Rs.8,00,000/- shall be paid by petitioner No. 1 to respondent No. 2 as full and final settlement towards all her claims qua maintenance, stridhan, alimony, etc. It is also submitted that out of the settled amount of Rs.8,00,000/-, remaining balance amount of Rs.3,00,000/- is being paid today by way of a demand draft bearing number 851997 drawn on Bank of Baroda.

5. The petitioners who are present in Court, have been identified by their counsel as well as by the I.O./ SI Vinod Kumar PS Anand Parbat, Delhi.

6. Respondent No. 2, who is also present in Court and identified by the I.O., states that she has settled her disputes with petitioner No.1 out of her own free will, volition and without any coercion. She also acknowledges the receipt of the entire settled amount and submits that she has no objection in case the FIR is quashed against the petitioners, subject to encashment of aforesaid draft of Rs.3,00,000/-.

7. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that no other proceedings are pending between the parties.

8. The parties shall remain bound by the statements and undertaking made in Court today.

9. In view of the above facts and since no useful purpose will be served in continuance of the present criminal proceedings, it is directed that the aforesaid FIR and the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed, subject to encashment of draft of Rs.3,00,000/-.

10. With the above directions, the petition is disposed of alongwith
