2 24-02-2025 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned APP
for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in connection with Cyber
P.S. Case No. 67 of 2024 instituted for the offence under
Sections 303(2), 318(2), 318(4), 319(2), 338, 336(2), 336(3),
340(2), 111 & 62(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

3. Prosecution case in short is that on secret
information regarding cyber crime, police raided the house of
petitioner and it is alleged that there is recovery of two mobile
phones, three ATM Cards and one motorcycle from his house.

4. It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner
that the petitioner is in custody since 06-12-2024. Petitioner
bears two criminal antecedents, as per disclosure made in



paragraph No. 3 of the bail application.

5. It has been further submitted by the petitioner's counsel that petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that motorcycle and ATM Cards belong to the petitioner and so far as, recovery of mobile is concerned, the same is planted. There is no independent witness to the occurrence. There is no compliance of Section 103 of the IPC. Charge sheet is submitted in this case.

6. Learned A.P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

7. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, period of custody of the petitioner and charge sheet being submitted, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

8. Let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Court below/concerned Court in connection with Cyber P.S. Case No. 67 of 2024, subject to the following conditions:

(I) One of the bailors shall be own/close member of the family of the petitioner.



(II) The petitioner shall appear on each and every date fixed at the trial. In case of default in such appearance on two consecutive dates, the Trial Court will have liberty to cancel the bail bonds of the petitioner.
