2 25-02-2025 1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and the
learned AC to SC-21.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are aggrieved by the fact that the Circle Officer, Charpokhari, is not complying the orders of the Collector and the DCLR, annexed as Annexures-1 & 5 to the writ application.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that it is an act of insubordination that the Circle Officer, despite specific direction passed by the Collector as contained in



Annexure-1, is not giving heeds to the order requiring the petitioners to move before this Court seeking a writ of mandamus.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners thereafter submits that from perusal of Annexure-1, i.e., order dated 27-6-2024 passed by the Collector-cum-2nd Appellate Authority, Bhojpur, Ara, it would manifest that the Collector-cum-2nd Appellate Authority has clearly directed the Circle Officer, Charpokhari to carry out the measurement of land for which petitioners have deposited the requisite fee.

5. It is submitted that petitioners produced the order of Collector dated 27-6-2024 before the Circle Officer, but then he is sitting tight over the matter. It is next submitted that the moment the land of the petitioners will get measured by the Circle Officer through the Amin the real fact would come to the fore that how private respondents are trying to encroach the settled land of the petitioners.

6. Learned State counsel submits that he does not have any objection in the event if the writ application is disposed of with a direction to the Circle Officer, Charpokhari to comply the order dated 27-6-2024 in Case No. 429110213122305300/2A passed by the Collector within a time



frame.

7. After hearing the learned counsel for the parties and without going into merits of the case, the writ application is disposed of with a direction to the Circle Officer, Charpokhari to comply the order dated 27-6-2024 passed by the Collector as contained in Annexure-1 to the writ application, within a period of 6 weeks from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this order.
