ORAL ORDER

2 16-04-2025 Heard Mr. Yugal Kishore, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners and Mr. Pawan Kumar Chaurasia, learned APP for the State.

2. The petitioners seek pre-arrest bail in connection with Phesar P.S. Case No. 63 of 2024 registered for the offence punishable under Sections 354(b), 504 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. As per the allegation made in the F.I.R., the informant was in relationship with one Munna Kumar and wanted to marry with him, but the parents of Munna Kumar demanded a sum of Rs. 5 lacs and a motorcycle as dowry and



for non-fulfillment of demand of dowry, the accused persons abused and insulted the father of the informant and refused to solemnize marriage of his son with the informant.

4. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submitted that the petitioner nos. 1 and 2 are the uncle of co-accused Munna Kumar and petitioner no.3 is his aunt, who is the wife of petitioner no.2 and they have no concern with the alleged incidence or the relationship of the co-accused Munna Kumar with the informant.

5. Learned APP for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioners.

6. Considering the nature of allegation made against the petitioners and the fact that there is no role of the petitioners in commission of offence as alleged in the F.I.R., the petitioners, above named, are directed to be released on pre-arrest bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the Court below within a period of four weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned ACJM, Aurangabad, Bihar in connection with Phesar P.S. Case No. 63 of 2024, subject to the condition as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.



7. The District Court is directed to verify the criminal antecedent of the petitioners and if it is found that the petitioners are involved in some other cases as what has been stated in Para-3 of the bail petition, this order will automatically lose its force.

8. The bail application stands disposed of.
