ORAL ORDER

4 03-11-2025 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned APP for the
State and the learned counsel for complainant.

2. The petitioner apprehends his arrest in connection with
Complaint Case No. 22 of 2023, registered for the offences
punishable under Sections 323, 498(A), 34 of the IPC.

3. It is a case of matrimonial dispute.

4. Vide order dated 02.05.2025, the matter was referred to
the Patna High Court Mediation and Conciliation Centre. The
report of the learned Mediator shows that the matter could not be
resolved between the parties and therefore, the mediation failed.

5. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that
the petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated. The



petitioner is a person of clean antecedent. He has submitted further that the petitioner is ready to pay Rs. 5,000/- per month as interim maintenance to daughter of the opposite party no. 2.

6. Considering the above-mentioned facts and circumstances, let the petitioner, in the event of his arrest or surrender within four weeks before the learned court below, be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sheohar in connection with Complaint Case No. 22 of 2023, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C./ 482(2) of the BNSS.

7. The petitioner is directed to pay Rs. 5,000/- per month as interim maintenance to daughter of the opposite party no. 2 (the complainant). The interim maintenance will be subject to any other order granted by any other Court of competent jurisdiction granting maintenance to daughter of the Opposite Party No. 2 (the complainant).
