2 10-04-2025 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned
A.P.P for the State.

2. The petitioner apprehends his arrest in Palasi P.S.
Case No. 72/2013, registered for offence under Sections 302, 34
of the Indian Penal Code.

3. The informant alleged that on 16.06.2013 at 4 PM,
his six years old daughter went missing and on the next date at
about 9:30 AM, her dead-body was recovered in the field of
Shamshad. Informant suspects that these petitioners have killed
his daughter by twisting her neck.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that
petitioners have been made accused only on suspicion. The
police after investigation submitted final form against



petitioners, however, differing with the same, the learned Court below took cognizance.

5. Learned A.P.P. for the State vehemently opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail and submits that petitioners are named in the F.I.R. and this anticipatory bail petition has been filed after lapse of more than 12 years without any plausible explanation of delay. Petitioners have also one criminal antecedent.

6. Considering the nature of accusation and delay in filing the bail petition, the prayer for anticipatory bail of petitioners is rejected.
