ORAL ORDER

20 16-09-2025 The instant appeal has been listed today under the heading 'For Orders (On Office Notes)'.

2. Upon perusal of the records, we find that *vide* order no.19 dated 24.06.2025, the matter was remanded back to the Juvenile Justice Board, Rohtas at Sasaram to pass appropriate orders regarding the detention and custody of the appellant namely, Deepak Pandey in accordance with the provisions of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act. The Juvenile Justice Board in compliance of the Court's order has passed order and submitted a report before this Court. The operative part of the said order passed by the Juvenile Justice Board states as follows:-



“After hearing of both the sides and sincere perusal of case record as well as Social Investigation Report it is clear that the occurrence was happened in this case due to land dispute. The child in conflict with law namely Deepak Pandey has spent the detention period i.e., two years four months and twenty-three days in the judicial custody and he regrets his past conducts and he is currently appointed as a government teacher and now he is a major. It is therefore child in conflict with law Deepak Pandey has already been rehabilitate and he wants to make his future bright hence no issues regarding rehabilitation, therefore, in his best interest and under such circumstances unanimously the board is of the view that he must be given an opportunity to join the main stream of society. Hence the child in conflict with law Deepak Pandey is hereby released on probation of good conduct as per Section 15 (1) sub-clause (f) of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000, for the period of six months and the Legal cum Probation Officer is directed to supervise the child in conflict with law Deepak Pandey and submit his report before the board. The child in conflict with law Deepak Pandey is on bail. His sureties are also discharged from their liabilities under their respective bail bonds.



Office clerk is directed to deposit the record in the record room as per law”.

3. The said report of Juvenile Justice Board, Rohtas at Sasaram is hereby accepted and the present Cr. Appeal (DB) No.693 of 2017 stands disposed off.
