APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in Industrial Area P.S.  
Case No. 84 of 2024, instituted for the offences punishable  
under Sections 341, 323, 324, 307, 447, 354(B), 379, 504, 506  
and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that, petitioner  
along with other co-accused persons armed with weapons  
brutally assaulted the informant and her son due to which they  
sustained injuries. It is alleged that the petitioner has  
indiscriminately hit with *Farsa* upon the informant's head.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the  
petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in the



present case due to previous enmity and land dispute. Charge-sheet has been submitted in this case. No incriminating material has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. Learned counsel for the petitioner also submits that there is no specific allegation attributed against the petitioner. The allegation levelled against the petitioner is general and omnibus in nature. There is case and counter case between the parties. It is further submitted that specific allegation of assault is against co-accused Ashok Sah. The petitioner is in custody since 09.06.2025 and has got three criminal antecedents in which he is on bail. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that co-accused Shubham Kumar has already been granted bail by this Court vide order dated 05.10.2024 passed in Cr. Misc. No. 71115 of 2024. Co-accused have also been granted anticipatory bail by this Court vide order dated 28.02.2025 passed in Cr. Misc. No. 13814 of 2025.

5. Learned APP for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner, stating that the offence alleged is serious in nature. He further submits that there is direct allegation against the petitioner of assault upon the Informant's head by means of *Farsa* due to which he sustained grievous injury over his head.



6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and taking into account the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

7. Let the petitioner be released on bail, *after framing of charge if not already framed*, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Court below/concerned Court in connection with Industrial Area P.S. Case No. 84 of 2024, subject to the following conditions;

(i) One of the bailors shall be own/close member of the family of the petitioner.

(ii) The petitioner shall appear on each and every date fixed at the trial. In case of default in such appearance on two consecutive dates, the Trial Court will have liberty to cancel the bail bonds of the petitioner.
