ORAL ORDER

2 23-09-2025 Heard learned counsel appearing on behalf of the
petitioner and learned APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks pre-arrest bail in connection
with Bodhi Bigha P.S. Case No. 25 of 2025 registered for the
offence punishable under Section 30(a) of the Bihar Prohibition
and Excise Act.

3. Allegation is of recovery of 45 litres of country
made liquor from the motorcycle bearing Registration No.
BR02S3001.

4. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the
petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and he has
committed no offence as alleged. The name of the petitioner was
disclosed by his younger brother only because he is the owner



of the motorcycle. He has no concern either with the seized liquor or trade of liquor in any manner. The petitioner has clean antecedent.

5. Learned APP for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner.

6. Having considered the rival submissions made on behalf of the parties and the nature of allegation against the petitioner, the petitioner, above named, is directed to be released on pre-arrest bail, in the event of his arrest or surrender before the Court below within a period of four weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned District Court where the case is pending in connection with Bodhi Bigha P.S. Case No. 25 of 2025, subject to the condition as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

7. The District Court is directed to verify the criminal antecedent of the petitioner and if it is found that the petitioner is involved in some other cases as what has been stated in Para-3 of the bail petition, this order will automatically lose its force.

8. The bail application stands disposed of.
