On such objections being filed, the Certificate Officer shall decide the matter on its own merits duly taking into consideration the objections filed by the petitioner and pass final orders under Section 10 of the Bihar and Orissa Public Demands Recovery Act, 1914 .

3. Till such time, the final orders are passed no coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioner.

4. The entire exercise shall be completed as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of twelve weeks from the date of receipt of the objections filed by the petitioner.

5. With the above directions, the present writ petitions stands disposed of.
