ORAL ORDER

3 25-11-2025 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State. Perused the case diary.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in connection with Mehus
P.S. Case No. 29 of 2025 instituted for the offences under
Sections 126(2), 127(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 352, 351(2) of the
Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

3. Prosecution case, in short, is that the petitioner
confined his 65-year-old father in a room and brutally assaulted
him with an iron rod over a dispute regarding sale of ancestral
property, causing fractures on his hands and legs.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the
petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case and the
allegations levelled in the FIR are false and concocted. Learned



counsel further submitted that the injury sustained by the informant are simple in nature. Learned counsel further submitted that petitioner had no intention to commit the murder of the informant who is his own father. It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that the petitioner is in custody since 25.07.2025 and has no criminal antecedent.

5. Learned A.P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case as also the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

7. Let the petitioner be released on bail, ***after framing of charge, if not already framed***, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Court below/concerned Court in connection with Mehus P.S. Case No. 29 of 2025, subject to the following conditions:

(I) One of the bailors shall be own/close member of the family of the petitioner.

(II) The petitioner shall appear on each and every date fixed at the trial. In case of default in such appearance on two consecutive dates, the Trial Court will have liberty to cancel the



bail bonds of the petitioner.

(III) If the petitioner tampers with the evidence or the witnesses, in that case, the prosecution will be at liberty to move for cancellation of bail.
