2. After some argument, Learned Counsel for the petitioners seeks permission to withdraw the present Civil Review petition.

3. Permission is granted.

Learned Counsel for the petitioners submits that time was granted vide order dated 25.07.2023 passed in CWJC No.3301 of 2023 to the petitioners to avail the remedy within 90 days from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this order passed in CWJC No.3301 of 2023.
