ORAL ORDER

3 22-04-2025 This contempt petition has been filed alleging

violation of order dated 11.07.2019, passed in C.W.J.C. No.

18818 of 2018, wherein this Court had passed the following

order:-

*“Considering the aforesaid, the writ
application is disposed of with a direction to the
respondents to take appropriate decision on the
claim of the petitioner within a maximum period
of 60 days from the date of receipt/production of a
copy of this order.*

*While taking decision, the respondents
keep in mind that no work no pay is applicable in
the case where the petitioner was not allowed to*



work. They have also to consider the case of the petitioner in the light of the case of similarly circumstanced and there is no justification to deny the same to the petitioner”

2. Opposite party nos. 3 to 5 have filed a show cause, wherein in paragraph nos. 6 and 7, it has been stated as under:-

“6. That it is humbly and respectfully submitted that in compliance of the order dated 11.07.2019 passed by this Hon'ble Court the answering opposite party No. 03 considered the case of the petitioner in the light of the order passed in analogous matter i.e. CWJC No. 20176/2019 (Kamlesh Roy versus The State of Bihar) by this Hon'ble Court in which case this Hon'ble Court has been pleased to direct to ensure payment of salary to the tune of 50 percent for the intervening period.

7. That accordingly the answering opposite party vide his order dated 15.12.2020 contained in Memo No. 4092 has allowed 50% of the salary during the period the petitioner was out of employment i.e. w.e.f. 01.11.2013 to 17.04.2016.”

3. On perusal of paragraph nos. 6 and 7 of the show cause filed by opposite party nos. 3 to 5, I find that the order dated 11.07.2019, passed in C.W.J.C. No. 18818 of 2018 has been complied with by the respondents.



4. In view of the above, the present contempt petition stands closed and disposed off.
