ORAL ORDER

2 25-02-2025 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned A.P.P for the State.

2. The petitioner has preferred this application for grant of regular bail in connection with Rampurhari P.S. Case No. 152 of 2024 dated 11.08.2024 registered for the offences punishable u/s 25(1-b)a, 26 and 35 of the Arms Act.

3. As per the prosecution case, one loaded country made pistol, two live cartridges, cash of Rs. 30,000/- and one mobile was recovered from the possession of Dhiraj Kumar (petitioner).

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in this case. The petitioner has no concern with the alleged



recovery. The name of the petitioner has transpired merely on the basis of suspicion. Nothing has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. The petitioner has six antecedents as stated in para 3 of the bail petition. The petitioner is in custody since 11.08.2024.

5. Learned A.P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the bail petition of the petitioner.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and the nature of allegation levelled against the petitioner as well as the period of custody, the petitioner above-named, is directed to be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail-bond of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Court concerned, Muzaffarpur in connection with Rampurhari P.S. Case No. 152 of 2024, with a condition/s:-

(i). The petitioner is directed to remain physically present before the learned Court below on each and every date, failing which on two consecutive dates without reasonable cause, the bail bond of the petitioner is liable to be cancelled.

7. The application stands allowed.
