Learned senior counsel representing the WBNUJS submits that his clients have decided to withdraw the order of suspension passed against the present petitioner and place the complaint made against him before the students' grievance redressal committee.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in such event, the three complaints made by

the petitioner may also be decided in accordance with law.
