Affidavit-of-service filed on behalf of the petitioner be kept with the record.

The petitioner was an approved Head Teacher of a primary school and retired from his said service on superannuation on February 29, 2024.

The Pension Payment Order of the petitioner was issued on September 02, 2024 in pursuance whereof he received the gratuity and the arrear pension on January 03, 2025.

In the instant writ petition the prayer of the petitioner is a writ of mandamus be issued commanding the respondents to pay interest on the said amount of arrear pension and gratuity for the delayed payment.

Learned advocate for the State-respondent does not oppose the prayer of the petitioner.

It is now well settled that the petitioner is entitled to the interest, as prayed for.

The respondents, the concerned Treasury Officer in particular are, therefore, directed to pay interest @ 8% per annum on the arrear amount of pension and gratuity from the date of retirement of the petitioner till the date of such payment.

The payment as aforesaid shall be made within the period of eight weeks from the date of communication of this order, in default the said arrear amount shall fetch an additional interest of 2% per annum.

W.P.A 1833 of 2025 stands disposed of with the above directions. There shall be no order as to costs.
