1. Heard the learned Advocates for the parties.
2. We have considered the materials on record. Though it is alleged houses were burnt, no one was injured. Co-accused have been granted pre-arrest bail. Petitioners contend they were always available at their residence but had not been arrested.
3. Under such circumstances, we are inclined to grant bail to the petitioners.
4. Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of the BNSS. They shall appear before the jurisdictional court and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date.
5. The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
