1. None appears on behalf of the petitioner on call.

No accommodation is sought for. Even on earlier occasions, none appeared on behalf of either of the parties on call.

2. This case pertains to the year 2010, almost 15 years have been elapsed.

3. The petitioner has approached before this court by filing the writ petition praying for a direction upon the respondent authorities to issue no objection certificate for explosive license which is urgently required by the Commerce and Industries Department, Government of West Bengal for grant of long term mining lease for excavating black stone in respect of plots as mentioned in the application of the petitioner for long term mining lease.

4. Considering the nature of prayer and long pendency of this case, this court finds that either the petitioner's purpose of filing writ

petition has been resolved or abandoned her prayer due to passage of time or became infructuous.

5. Under the circumstances, no purpose would be sub-served in keeping the writ petition pending any further.
6. In the above backdrop, the instant writ petition being **WPA 6331 of 2010** is **dismissed** without any order as to costs.
7. Consequently, the connected applications, if any, are also, thus, disposed of.
8. Interim order, if any, stands vacated.
