In Re: - An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C./Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with **Talpati Ghat Coastal** P.S. Case No.**19 of 2024** dated **15.02.2024** under Sections **186 / 323 / 325 / 332 / 333 / 341 / 353 / 379 / 506 / 34** of the Indian Penal Code.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submits as follows. There were two FIRs started over the same incident. Thereafter, these were clubbed together. The petitioners were named in the second FIR. The allegations of security guard being hackled and his service revolver being taken away is against other accused. The petitioners have been implicated in this case due to political rivalry.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. He refers to the injury report and the statements of the witnesses, although the injury appears to be simple.

Considering the nature of allegations and the role ascribed to the present petitioners, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the present petitioners is required in this case.

In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further condition that the petitioners shall co-operate with investigation and shall meet the Investigating Officer once a fortnight till the submission of report in final form and the petitioners shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
