Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are the brother in-in-law and the sister-in-law of the victim. Similarly circumstanced accused have been granted bail.

The State is represented.

Considering the nature of allegations and the grant of anticipatory bail to similarly circumstanced accused by an order dated 16.04.2025 in CRM(A) 1191 of 2024, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (rupees ten thousand) each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure,

1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on the further condition that the petitioners shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
