CRM (A) 1597 of 2025

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Sonarpur P.S. Case No.627 of 2025 dated 20.04.2025 under Sections 85/126(2)/115(2)/117(2)/352/303(2)/351(2) of BNS pending before the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Baruipur.

It is an admitted position that the couple got married long ago, have two daughters aged about 7 and 2 years, respectively and the wife had been staying at her parental home since six months after marriage.

In the view of the nature of allegations and the materials available in the case diary, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required in this case. Accordingly, the application for anticipatory bail is allowed.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid

down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition to cooperate with the investigation and shall meet the Investigating Officer once a fortnight till submission of report in final form and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses or tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever.

The application for anticipatory bail being **CRM (A) 1597 of 2025** is, thus, allowed.
