Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits as follows. The petitioner is the married sister-in-law of the alleged victim. The marriage between the couple took place two years ago. There are only general allegations against the other in-laws. The principal accused is the husband who is in custody. The main allegation is that principal accused had an affair with another person and both of them used to inflict torture.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. She refers to the statements of the witnesses including the independent ones and the post mortem report.

Considering the fact that the principal accused is still in custody, the alleged role ascribed to the present petitioner and the fact that charge sheet has been submitted, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further condition that the petitioner shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses and shall attend the jurisdictional Court on dates fixed.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
