CRM (A) 1762 of 2025

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Garden Reach P.S. Case No.115 of 2025 dated 21.04.2025 under Section 196(1)(a)/299/352/353(1)(c) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 pending before the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Alipore, South 24-Parganas.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

It has to be finally decided by Courts whether the ingredients of the alleged offences are made out against the petitioner

But, without even going into the merits of the case, it can be said that a responsible citizen should refrain himself from making unnecessary and objectionable statements in the public domain.

However, considering the nature of allegations and the materials available in the case diary, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required in this case and I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition that he shall cooperate with the investigation and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses, whatsoever.

The application for anticipatory bail being **CRM(A) 1762 of 2025** is, thus, allowed.
