Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Peruse the case diary.

Considering the fact that the only material available against the petitioner is the statement of a co-accused, he has been able to rebut the restriction contained in Section 37 of the NDPS Act and considering the fact that similarly circumstanced co-accused was granted anticipatory bail by this Court on in CRM (A) 1921 of 2025 dated 03.07.2025 and a charge sheet has already been submitted, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further condition that the

petitioner shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses, shall attend the jurisdictional Court regularly and shall surrender before the jurisdictional Court and pray for bail within four weeks from this date.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
