CRM (A) 2221 of 2025

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Kalna P.S. Case No.365 of 2025 dated 04.04.2025 under Sections 137(2)/ 115(2)/ 118(2)/ 61(2)/ 62/ 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

Considering the nature of allegations and the materials available in the case diary including the statement of the victim and the injury report showing fracture injury on the victim while I am not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner no.2 (Manik Sk.), the application for anticipatory bail of the petitioner no.1((Begam Bibi Seikh @ Begam Bibi Sk.), the petitioner no.3 (Nabab Sk.) and the petitioner no.4 (Lokman Sekh) is allowed.

Accordingly, the application for anticipatory bail of the petitioner no.2 (Manik Sk.) is hereby rejected.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner no.1(Begam Bibi Seikh @ Begam Bibi Sk.), the petitioner no.3 (Nabab Sk.) and the petitioner no.4 (Lokman Sekh) shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond

of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition that the petitioner nos.3 and 4 shall meet the Investigating Officer once a week till submission of the report in final form and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses, whatsoever.

The application for anticipatory bail being **CRM (A) 2221 of 2025** is, thus, partly allowed.
