Learned counsels appearing on behalf of the petitioner and the CESC Ltd. submit that 50 per cent of the finally assessed amount has been deposited by the petitioner.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

Considering the fact that 50 per cent of the finally assessed amount has been paid, the materials available in the case diary and the fact that charge sheet has been submitted, I am inclined to grant the application for anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount

each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further condition that the petitioner shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
