Case No. **182 of 2025** dated **21.04.2025** under Sections **109/115(2)/117(2)/3(5)/303(2)/329(3)/329(4)/74** of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

Considering the materials available in the case diary including the statements of witnesses, the injury report showing fracture injury and the alleged role ascribed to each of the present petitioners while I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner nos. 1 and 2, the application for anticipatory bail of the petitioner no. 3 is rejected.

Thus, in the event of arrest, the petitioner Nos. 1 and 2 shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further condition that the petitioner Nos. 1 and 2 shall cooperate with investigation, shall meet the I.O. once a week till

submission of report in final form and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

Accordingly, the application for anticipatory bail is disposed of.
