1. Heard the learned counsels for the parties.
2. Perused the case diary.
3. It is the prime contention of the petitioners that there was an ongoing business relation between the private parties. The FIR has been lodged to recover alleged dues which are disputed.
4. Considering the nature of allegations and the fact that the allegations have a distinct civil flavour and the materials available in the case diary, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the petitioners is required in this case and I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
5. In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local,

to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to further conditions that the petitioners shall cooperate with the investigation and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses. The petitioners shall meet the I.O once a fortnight till submission of report in final form.

6. Accordingly, the instant application for anticipatory bail is allowed.
7. Urgent photostat certified copy of this order, if applied for, be given to the parties upon compliance with requisite formalities.
