CRM (A) 2810 of 2025

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Maheshtala P.S. Case No.469/2024 dated 14.09.2024 under Sections 118(2)/109/3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

It appears that in a fight between neighbours, the victims were seriously assaulted, one with a knife on the neck and another at the forehead with iron rod, which required stitches to repair the wound.

It also appears that a female member of the family was granted anticipatory bail by a Division Bench of this Court, albeit, after taking note of the fact that she was a lady.

Considering the above and the incriminating materials available in the case diary and in view of the alleged role ascribed to the present petitioner, I do not consider this to be a fit case for granting anticipatory bail to the present petitioner.

The application for anticipatory bail being **CRM (A) 2810 of 2025** is, thus, rejected.
