CRM (A) 2844 of 2025

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Parnasree P.S. Case No.362 of 2025 dated 14.05.2025 under Section 420 of the Indian Penal Code.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

It appears that the prime allegation is that an accommodation loan given to a friend was not repaid.

Considering the above, the other materials on record and the fact that bulk of documents have been seized, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required in this case and I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure,

corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition that the petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation and shall meet the Investigating Officer as and when required and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses, whatsoever.

The application for anticipatory bail being **CRM (A) 2844 of 2025** is, thus, allowed.
