Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

The allegation is that the accused had taken money to give the victim a job in the PHE Department. The job was not given not given. Nor was the money returned. The victim committed suicide. Another accused was granted bail.

It will be for the Courts of law to finally decide whether there is an element of abetment of suicide in this case.

However, considering the materials available on record and the role ascribed to the present petitioner, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required in this case and I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, the application for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is allowed.

However, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further conditions that the petitioner shall not threaten or intimidate the witnesses and shall co-operate with investigation. The petitioner shall meet the Investigating Officer once a fortnight till submission of report in final form.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
