An application for anticipatory bail under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Galsi Police Station Case No.418 of 2025 dated 02.07.2025 under Sections 318(4)/316(2) of the BNS, 2023.

Report filed by the State is taken on record.

Heard learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

It appears from the report that the petitioner had acted as a broker in the second-hand sale of a truck to the de facto complainant. It further appears from the report and the statement of the bank officer that as the purchaser/de facto complainant was not able to pay EMI, he surrendered the truck to the finance company.

Considering the materials available in the case diary and the alleged role ascribed to the present petitioner, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on the further conditions that the petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation, shall meet the investigating officer once a fortnight till submission of report in final form and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
