**CRM (A) 3155 of 2025**

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Burtolla PS Case No.136 dated 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2025 under Sections 135/138 of the Electricity Act, 2003.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

It appears that more than half of the finally assessed amount has already been paid in respect of the bill generated by the Electricity authorities.

Considering the above and the materials available in the case diary, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the present petitioner.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure,

corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition that the petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses or tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever and the petitioner shall meet the Investigating Officer as and when required.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
