1. Petitioner contends that the allegations do not disclose ingredients of cognizable offences.
2. I have considered the materials on record. Petitioners are the son and daughter-in-law respectively of the opposite party No.2/complainant. In the complaint opposite party No.2 has alleged that she is a cardiac patient. Petitioner No.1 and his wife, that is, petitioner No.2 had held out threats at her. On 07/02/2024 they came to their residence and abused her in a threatening manner. They even poured kerosene oil with bad intention. Opposite party No.2 apprehends threat to her life and security. These uncontroverted allegations *inter alia* make out a case under Section 23 of the Senior Citizen Act.
3. Credibility of the allegations are subject matter of the investigation and interference in the proceeding would amount to prejudging them.

4. Hence I am not inclined to entertain the petition. It is open to the petitioners to agitate their defences in the event the investigation results in the filing of a police report against them.
5. With the observation the application being **CRR 3753 of 2024** is disposed of.
