Learned advocate for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is in custody for one year and there has been no progress in the trial of the case, although, the case has been committed to the court of Sessions.

Learned advocate for the State submits that five witnesses have been relied upon in order to prove the prosecution’s case.

Having considered the overall circumstances of the case, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

Hence, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is **Rejected.**

However, the trial court is directed to expedite the case as very few witnesses have been relied upon by the prosecution. No unnecessary adjournment be granted to any

of the parties and the trial of the case would continue inspite of any resolution of the local Bar.

Accordingly, CRM(M) 1664 of 2025 is **dismissed**.
