1. Affidavit of service filed in Court today is taken on record.
2. The petitioner claims interest on delayed payment of terminal benefits. The petitioner superannuated from service of the WBTCCL on **December 31, 2023**. He received his provident fund benefits of **Rs.26,29,967/-** towards provident fund on **October 24, 2024**.
3. The petitioner is entitled to interest for the period from **January 01, 2024** to **October 24, 2024** at the rate of 6 per cent per

annum. Let the same be paid to the petitioner by the WBTCL within a period of one month from date.

4. In default of payment as directed above, the rate of interest shall stand increased to 9 per cent per annum.
5. The writ petition is disposed of.
6. There will be no order as to costs.
