1. By this application, the petitioner seeks expeditious disposal of Misc. Case No.250 of 2013, which is pending before the learned Civil Judge (Senior Division), 1st Court at Barasat.
2. Considering the submissions, this Court is of the view that the prayer of the petitioner is innocuous. Neither party stands to lose if a proceeding is disposed of expeditiously. In fact, such expeditious disposal shall enure to the benefit of the parties. Hence, there is no requirement for service of prior notice upon the opposite parties.
3. Under such circumstances, the revisional application is disposed of with a direction upon the learned court to dispose of the misc. case as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of two months from the next date fixed, considering the fact that the decree is of 1995.
4. This court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of the misc. case. The learned court shall proceed independently and in accordance with law.
5. The revisional application is accordingly disposed of.

6. A copy of the revisional application, along with a server copy of this order be served upon the opposite parties and/or the learned advocate contesting the matter on behalf of the opposite parties in the learned trial court.
7. There shall be no order as to costs.
8. Parties are to act on the server copy of this order.
