Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is in custody for four-year-one-month and, till date, out of the 16 witnesses proposed to be examined by the prosecution, only three witnesses have been examined.

Learned advocate prays for bail of the petitioner under Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

Learned advocate for the State has produced the Case Diary.

I have perused the materials on record and, I find that the petitioner – being the sole accused, has slashed the neck of his mother-in-law when she refused to give him a sum of Rs. 1 lakh.

Having regard to the alleged heinousness of the offence, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail - as he may turn dangerous to the society, until and unless the trial court by way of evidence comes to a finding of acquittal.

Hence, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is **Rejected.**

Accordingly, CRM(M) 1959 of 2025 is **dismissed.**
